<p style="text-align: center;">PENITENTIAL ACT</p> <p>We recall our sins and the need for mercy and reconciliation</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">HOMILY</p> <p>The presider shares reflections on the message of God's word which we have just heard</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">CONSECRATION</p> <p>The words that recall Christ's actions at the Last Supper; through these words and power of the Spirit (epiclesis) Jesus again becomes present in the bread and wine</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">BLESSING AND DISMISSAL</p> <p>We are sent forth to live the Eucharist with strength and courage</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PROFESSION OF FAITH (CREED)</p> <p>We stand to profess what we believe</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">GLORIA</p> <p>We sing this joyful hymn of praise</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PRESENTATION AND PREPARATION OF GIFTS</p> <p>We bring our gifts of bread and wine to the altar; we also offer ourselves</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION</p> <p>We proclaim our belief in Jesus' death, resurrection, and final coming</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">SIGN OF PEACE</p> <p>The community shares a sign of peace to show we forgive and love one another</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">SECOND READING</p> <p>We listen to a reading from the letters of the New Testament</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">THE COLLECT (opening prayer)</p> <p>The presider gathers together all our needs and presents them to God; we respond, "Amen"</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PRAYER OVER GIFTS</p> <p>The presider invites us to pray with him that God will accept our gifts</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">LORD'S PRAYER</p> <p>As we prepare to receive communion, we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">FIRST READING</p> <p>The lector proclaims a reading from the Old Testament; we answer, "Thanks be to God"</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">COMMUNION</p> <p>We receive Jesus in the bread and wine and say "Amen," which means "Yes, I believe"</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">PSALM RESPONSE</p> <p>We respond to God's word in the reading through the words and music of a psalm</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PREFACE; EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER</p> <p>The presider begins this great prayer by praising God for the wonderful works of creation and redemption</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">LAMB OF GOD</p> <p>We sing this litany for the breaking of the bread, asking for mercy and peace</p>
